

TYPES OF RIDERS

ADULT RIDERS

- 12 years of age and older

CHILD RIDERS

- 7 thru 11 years of age
- Under 7 years of age and not accompanied by a rider paying an adult fare
- Groups of unrelated children under 7 years of age even though accompanied by an adult rider.

STUDENT RIDERS

- 12 years of age and older presenting a valid Student Identification Card, subject to conditions printed on the back of the card.

SENIOR CITIZEN RIDERS

- 65 years of age and older presenting a Senior Citizen Reduced Fare Permit card.

FREE RIDERS

- Under 7 years of age, provided they are accompanied by a rider paying an adult fare.
- CTA employees and pensioners presenting their badge or Identification Card.
- Chicago Police Officers, Chicago Police Cadets, and Suburban Police Officers in their own municipality. Chicago Police Cadets ride free only in full uniform. Chicago and Suburban Police Officers ride free in full uniform; if not in uniform they must present their star or badge and their Police I.D. card or pass.
- Chicago Firemen, Chicago Fire Department Cadets, and Suburban Firemen in their own municipality and only when in full uniform.
- Chicago Health Dep't. nurses, Chicago Municipal Tuberculosis Sanitarium nurses, and Suburban Health Dep't. nurses in their own municipality. Female nurses must be in full uniform. Male nurses must have their badge openly displayed on their outer garment.
- Chicago and Oak Park women crossing guards in their own municipality, in full uniform, and only on school days between 7:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.
