New CTA Bus Services Tailored for Commuters

in A.M. Rush Hours

(EFFECTIVE MARCH 1)

For the convenience of commuters during the morning rush hours, Mondays through Fridays, Chicago Transit Authority will inaugurate two new downtown bus services on March 1, 1948. Here are the detailed routings of the new lines:

UNION STATION - DOWNTOWN SERVICE

A special Union Station-Downtown service will be operated at frequent intervals between 7:40 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Buses will start from Union Station, run east on Adams Street to State Street; south on State to VanBuren Street; west on VanBuren (past LaSalle Street Station and the New Post Office Building) to Clinton Street; north on Clinton to Adams Street; east on Adams to Union Station.

Loopbound commuters should board these buses at the Adams

Street exit of Union Station.

UNION AND NORTHWESTERN STATIONS - NORTH LOOP SERVICE

A special Union Station-Northwestern Station-North Loop bus service, supplementing the present Canal-Wacker operation, will run on a frequent schedule between 7:45 a.m. and 8:35 a.m. Buses will operate west on Adams Street from State to Franklin; south on Franklin to Jackson Boulevard; west on Jackson to Canal Street; north on Canal to Randolph Street; east on Randolph to Wacker Drive and east on Wacker to Wabash Avenue.

Commuters from Union Station should board these buses at the Canal Street exit; from Northwestern Station, at Canal and Madison Streets, or any of the regular Canal-Wacker bus stops.
