Another Step in CHICAGO TRANSIT AUTHORITY'S Modernization Program

Modern, streamlined streetcars and buses will replace old equipment on Halsted Street, effective at 12:01 a.m. Sunday, December 4, 1949. Streetcars will operate between Waveland Avenue, on the north, and

Service on the portion of the Halsted Street line south of 79th Street, will be provided by modern motor buses which will make transfer connections with the new streetcars in the off-street terminal at 79th Street.

Extensions of Service

Two route extensions are included in the new Halsted service:

Buses replacing Halsted streetcars on the south end of the line will operate on Halsted and on Vincennes Avenue to Monterey Avenue, and then on 111th Street as far west as Pulaski Road, eliminating the transfer now required at Sacramento Avenue, the present terminal of the Halsted streetcar line.

The present South Halsted Street bus route, which operates from 127th Street to 87th Street, will be extended northward to 79th Street, connecting directly with streamlined Clark-Wentworth cars at 81st and Halsted, and with the modern Halsted streetcars in the off-street terminal at 79th and Halsted.

■ 16½ Percent Increase in Local Transit Units on Halsted Street

104 modern streetcars and 30 motor buses will replace the 115 vehicles now operating on the Halsted Street route. Rush hour headways between streetcars will be about 1½ minutes, and between buses on the south end of the line, the intervals will be about 2¼ minutes.

180,000 Riders Every Weekday to Share the Benefits of Modern Equipment and Better Service

Every weekday approximately 106,000 riders start their local transit trips on Halsted Street. An additional 74,000 transfer to the route. Thus a total of 180,000 riders each weekday will be benefited by the new equipment and improved service on Halsted Street.

663 Miles of Surface Routes Equipped with New Buses and Streetcars

With modern streetcars and motor buses in service on Halsted Street, CTA will have a total of 663 miles of its surface routes equipped with new vehicles. Six routes, including Halsted, are equipped with noise-proofed streetcars, forty-nine routes with motor buses and six routes with silent-operating trolley buses. The noise level on all of these routes has been substantially reduced by the new rubber-tired or rubber-insulated vehicles.

53 Percent of CTA Weekday Surface System Rides Now Originate on Modern Vehicles

With Halsted Street added to the list of newly equipped lines, more than half of each weekday's originating rides—53 percent—will start in modern CTA equipment. This percentage, of course, will continue to increase as the CTA modernization program progresses.



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
