MODERN BUSES REPLACE STREETCARS ON WESTERN AVENUE (Route No. 49) Effective June 17, 1956

EFFECTIVE Sunday, June 17, 1956, the one-man streetcars on Western Avenue disappear from that line, being replaced by modern buses.

This conversion from streetcars to buses will clear the way for the City of Chicago to proceed with its program of building vehicular traffic grade separations in heavily used Western Avenue intersections as well as repaying of the street.

The bus route remains the same as the streetcar route, with schedules being substantially the same. Buses will operate between the present north terminal at Berwyn and Western Avenues and the existing south terminal at 79th Street and Western Avenue, thereby retaining the functional characteristics of the route that prevent delays in trafficcongested areas from impairing the regularity of service on the outer reaches of Western Avenue.

The major difference under the new arrangement is that passengers will board and alight at the curb where bus stop zones will be established.
