95th Station Exact Fare Program



Starting Sunday, July 21, 1991, there will be a major change in how you pay your fare at the 95th Street-Dan Ryan CTA rail station. We will begin collecting fares using a method similar to the one used on our bus system. This means you will be able to pay exact fare at automated turnstiles, using either coins or our money-saving tokens or passes.

Earlier experiments, coupled with our recent test project at Morse Avenue on the far north side, indicate that automated exact fare collection on rail saves time and money and enables us to operate more efficiently. The development of state-of-the-art fare collecting equipment allows us to put this new policy into place now. You will benefit by moving through the station more quickly, since ticket agents will no longer issue change, accept adult cash fares, or sell tokens. They will accept transfers and passes, and provide information. Reduced-fare riders will pass through one designated agent position; that agent will handle all reduced-fare transactions, including exact cash fare, tokens, passes, and transfers.

How to enter the 95th Street Station

Full-Fare Riders

If you have a transfer, you may enter the station through any of the six ticket agent positions.

If you have a token, use the automated turnstiles for quick entry. Should you require a transfer, deposit the token and a quarter or 25 cents in any combination of nickels and dimes.

If you have a regular CTA monthly pass, enter through any of the six ticket agent positions. If you have a Quick•Tic or QuikPass, use any of the six automated turnstiles or any of the six ticket agent positions.

The Quick • Tic or QuikPass can be used to enter any rail station or board any bus, or to quickly enter at any rail station equipped with automated pass reading turnstiles, such as 95th Street.

If you use coins, you must deposit the exact fare in the turnstile. You may also receive a transfer by depositing the correct exact fare payment. [\$1.50 in nickels, dimes, quarters, or Susan B. Anthony dollar coins.]

For your convenience, three token vending machines are available for purchase of 10-packs of full-fare tokens for \$9 each. To buy your token 10-pack, just insert a \$10 bill or any combination of \$5 and \$1 bills, and/or nickels, dimes, quarters, or Susan B. Anthony dollar coins. You will receive change in coins for any amount over \$9.

Adult tokens are available at the 95th Street terminal office which is open from 7:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m.

IN SUMMARY, YOU CANNOT USE CASH TO PAY YOUR FARE TO A TICKET AGENT, AND TURNSTILES DO NOT ACCEPT DOLLAR BILLS. EXACT FARE MUST BE PAID WITH A TOKEN, TOKEN + 25 CENTS FOR TRANSFER, COINS, OR CTA MONTHLY PASSES.


Reduced-Fare Riders

All reduced-fare riders will enter the station through a designated reduced-fare ticket agent position [see Diagram for location].

Remember, you must pay exact fare in coins, or use a CTA pass, token, or transfer. Paper money will not be accepted for an individual fare and change will not be available.

Purchase tokens at your neighborhood currency exchange, bank, Jewel or Dominick's food stores, or the terminal office at 95th Street station. The 95th station terminal office will sell reduced fare tokens Monday through Saturday from 8am until 6pm.

Ticket agents will no longer sell tokens.
