LOOP TOUR TRAIN

From May 6, 2000, through September 30, 2000, Loop Tour Trains depart from the Randolph/Wabash station every Saturday afternoon at 11:35 a.m., 12:15 p.m., 12:55 p.m., and 1:35 p.m. Each Tour runs approximately 40 minutes.



Chicago Architecture Foundation docents present the history of the 100-year-old downtown area and elevated train system. Located downtown, the 'L' offers a unique vantage point for seeing Chicago's internationally renowned architecture.



Tickets for the Loop Tour Train are free and available at the Chicago Cultural Center Visitor Information Center, 77 E. Randolph Street at Michigan Avenue. Please obtain tickets in advance on the day of the tour. They are issued on a first-come, first-serve basis. Tickets may be used only on Saturday afternoons at the time indicated on the tickets.



The Loop Tour Train is wheelchair accessible. Please make arrangements when the tickets are picked up. The train can be scheduled to stop at the fully accessible Clark/Lake CTA station. The Chicago Cultural Center Visitor Information Center opens at 10 a.m. on Saturday.
