

# The Best Way To Go To The World's Fair

Street cars provide the most direct service to the Century of Progress Exposition of any local transportation agency in the city. Chicago Surface Lines passengers are delivered at the ramps or stairways leading into the 18th and 23rd Street gates, and only a few feet from the gates. These two entrances are the most popular because they are in the heart of the grounds and convenient to the most important buildings and exhibits.

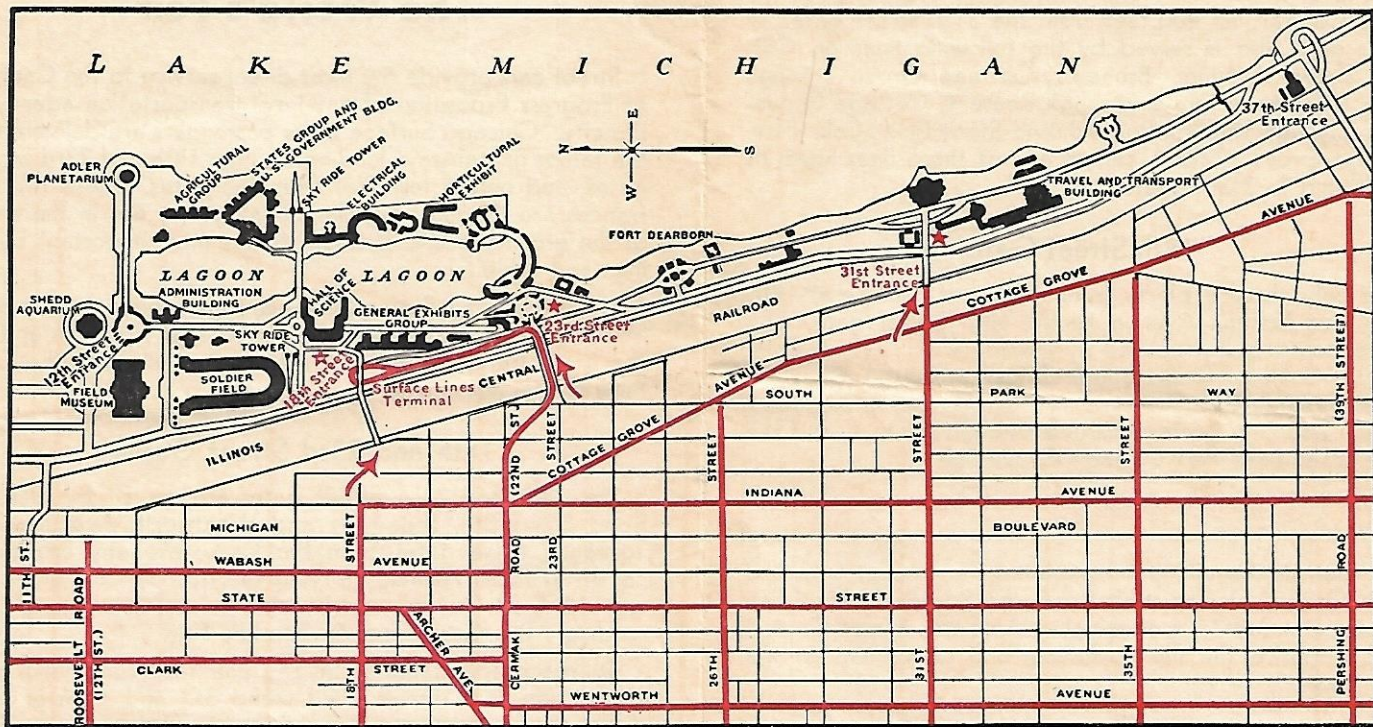
In addition the Surface Lines are convenient to the 31st Street gate, which is only about 400 feet from the end of the 31st Street line and but a block farther from the Cottage Grove Avenue line.

## 18th and 23rd Street Gates

The 18th and 23rd Street gates are served by Cermak Road (22nd St.), Broadway and Wentworth Avenue cars. To reach these gates from the loop, take any Broadway car on Wabash Avenue carrying the destination sign reading "18 & 23 Gates," and bearing in addition a dash sign reading "This Car Direct To World's Fair."

To reach the gates from any line that runs north and south, ride to Cermak Road (22nd St.) and transfer east direct to the entrances. On north side east and west lines transfer to cars on Broadway, which go direct to the entrances. On south side east and west lines between 63rd Street and Cermak Road (22nd St.) transfer to Wentworth Avenue cars bearing the destination signs mentioned above direct to the entrances.

This map shows the convenience of service provided by the Surface Lines, which are printed in red. The three most important entrances are served directly by street cars. No other local transportation is so convenient. (See details of service on reverse pages.)



## 31st Street Gate

The 31st Street line terminates at the viaduct over the Illinois Central just 400 feet from the 31st Street gate.

This gate also is served by the following lines on Cottage Grove Avenue: Broadway-Cottage Grove Through Route 1, Cottage Grove Through Route 4, Cottage Grove-South Chicago Through Route 5, and Stony Island-Lake Park-Cottage Grove. Take a car on any of these lines north or southbound to 31st Street.

## 18th Street Gate

It is only about 3 blocks from the street car line at 18th Street and Indiana Avenue to the 18th Street gate. The intersection may be reached by the following cars: Indiana Avenue, Cottage Grove-South Chicago Through Route 5, Lincoln-Indiana Through Route 3, Cottage Grove-Broadway Through Route 1, Cottage Grove Through Route 4, and the Stony Island-Lake Park-Cottage Grove line.

These lines provide splendid service from the southeast section of Chicago.

As soon as the city has completed the viaduct over the Illinois Central at Roosevelt Road, the Roosevelt Road line will be extended to a terminal east of the Illinois Central tracks opposite the Field Museum and convenient to the north gates.

Traffic congestion in the neighborhood of the grounds makes the use of automobiles practically prohibitive. The most convenient, the quickest and most economical way of going to the Fair is by street car.
